Libby Crabtree brings 20 years' experience performing in London's West End, singing on countless film backing tracks and live tours of cabaret shows, to tell you all about *Show Boat* (1927), *Oklahoma* (1943), *A Chorus Line* (1975), and *Evita* (1979). As well as learning about the significant changes each show brought about, Libby will lead you through the most popular songs from each one.


Health and Wellbeing through Song for Beginners: 10.30am-12.30pm on Tuesdays 23 January to 12 March 2024, led by Anne Lewis.
