Here's a little extra for those of you who love plainchant – I shall direct Strathclyde University Chamber Choir who will be joined by Rebecca Tavener as Cantor for a celebration of Glasgow's Patron Saint, familiarly known as Mungo. Arranged by the <u>St Mungo Festival</u>, this will take place on **Wednesday 15 January 2025**, close to the day of his Feast Day in <u>St Andrew's Metropolitan Cathedral</u> in Clyde Street, Glasgow, and will feature chant from medieval manuscripts celebrating Saints Kentigern, Brigit of Kildare and Columba.
