Scots Song Series – Tuesdays 22 April to 26 May, 1.00pm-3.00pm:

what better way to explore the themes of life, love, loss, the natural world and the supernatural than through your voice? Immerse yourself in the inspirational world of our nation's traditional folk repertoire. No singing experience required: you will learn songs by ear in the traditional way, and gain confidence in your singing abilities with this enriching experience. Also led by **Carole Irvine**.

Folk Songs of the World – Wednesdays 23 April to 18 June 2025, 10.30am-12.30pm: everyone loves a traditional song and this living, growing repertoire with timeless and universal themes keeps evolving. These songs come from an oral tradition and need no musical expertise to enjoy. Their inclusiveness, storytelling, and history as a true 'people's music' adds to their attraction. Participants will develop an understanding of performance, listen to recordings and, above all, enjoy the experience of singing together. No music-reading ability is required but the willingness to have a go is! Led by <u>Bill Jones</u>.
